



Fabric, Photos & Memories Supply List

We are going to have a total blast in this class! You don't even have to sew a stitch if you don't want to. I will give instructions for sewing and fusing your projects, so either way you want to create is fine with me. And either way, your book will look amazing!

There are some items that you will need to purchase. I have given some websites for online shops that I have used and recommend. If you have any questions or problems locating any item, please email me at shirleypando@earthlink.net so I can help you make substitutions if need be.

Fabrics, Trims, etc. – To create our book you **need** to have each of these:

1. 1 yard of cotton duck cloth or canvas in natural color
2. Fabrics: cotton, prints, cheesecloth, tulle, sheers, blue jeans, drapery fabrics, and any other fabric pieces you would like to use in your book.
3. Trims: lace, ribbon, rickrack, twill, fabric strips, etc.

Print and transfer Photos - You will be learning many types of techniques to print and transfer photos to fabric. Choose one or all of these.

1. Prepackaged printable fabric sold in packs of 8.5" x 11" sheets for your specific computer – cotton or canvas (such as June Tailor brand)
2. ExtravOrganza – 100% silk organza that is sold in packs of 8.5" x 11" sheets
3. Bubble Jet Set 2000 **AND** 100% cotton fabric to print your photos on, white or natural **AND** freezer paper (found in the grocery store)
4. Acrylic medium **AND** transparencies for your specific printer **AND** muslin or cotton fabric, white or natural
5. Glossy photo paper **AND** cotton fabric **AND** a spray bottle of water
6. Lutradur **AND** acrylic medium (sold by the yard at www.joggles.com)
7. Transfer Artist Paper <http://www.lesleyriley.com/store.php?cat=1> **AND** fabric, white or natural
8. Sheer Heaven www.cre8it.com **AND** cotton fabric **AND** a spray bottle of rubbing alcohol

Fusing Fabrics – You will need any or all of these types of fusible products. Even if you want to machine sew your book, have at least one on hand. Get a double-sided fusible. They may be any one of these products: Bo-Nash 007 Bonding Agent, Fast-2-Fuse, Misty Fuse, Stitch-N-Tear, Steam-A-Seam 2, Stitch Witchery fusible, Timtex, or Wonder Under.

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Coloring Fabrics - You will be learning many ways to color fabric. Choose one or all of these.

- Brewed coffee or tea
- Easter egg dye tablets **AND** white vinegar **AND** lemon juice **AND** measuring utensils **AND** cloth for dyeing **AND** plastic containers
- Acrylic craft paints, scrapbook paints, fluid acrylics, Lumiere, oil pastels, etc., whatever you have on hand.
- Household bleach **AND** large image foam stamps

Embellishments - The first 5 items will be used in the creative lesson. The rest are suggestions of what you may want to use in your books. Use anything you have on hand.

- Buttons, needle and thread
- DMC thread, embroidery needle
- Clear acrylic buttons
- Stazon ink, rubber stamps
- Ribbon of various widths, rick rack, twill
- Fabric scraps, felt, tulle (netting)
- Beads, beading needle
- Mica
- Decorative papers
- Metal words
- Embroidered patches
- Velvet leaves
- Silk, paper or fabric flowers
- Safety pins
- Charms
- Chinese coins

Tools

- Iron, ironing board
- Sewing machine, needles, thread (optional)
- Printer, photos printable from your computer
- Fabric scissors, pinking shears
- Rotary cutter, self-healing mat, quilters' ruler (optional)
- Embroidery threads in colors of your choice, embroidery needles
- Plastic wrap, paper towels
- Freezer paper, parchment paper (both found in the grocery store)
- Pins, quilters' marking pencils, optional
- Acrylic paints-scrapbook paints, craft paints, water color paints, Lumiere's, Dye-Na-Flow, water color crayons, acrylic inks, Distress ink re-inkers, dyes, etc., whatever you have
- Paint brushes, paint palette or paper plate
- Container of water
- Bone folder, painters' tape
- Solvent ink pads(like Staz-on), rubber stamps
- Rubber or latex gloves
- Nonstick craft sheet or plastic sheeting (garbage bag cut open will work, too)
- Large tub or cookie sheet that will not be used for food afterward (a gallon zip top bag will work, too.)
- Masks or stencils or sequin waste (Punchinella)
- Fabri-tack or other fabric glue if you don't plan to sew

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
